# **PART 1**

## 1. PHINEAS P. GAGE

On days when you happen to have more leisure time than usual, do you ever find yourself repeating certain simple acts of behavior, or experiencing bizarre thought patterns? You may get up and walk to the window an inordinate amount of times, or open the refrigerator door frequently throughout the day, even though you are not hungry. You may find yourself glancing in the mirror more frequently, or compulsively washing your hands when normally you would not do so. Perhaps you turn on the TV, when the very thought of sitting in front of it seems revolting, or you stare at the computer for hours with no real worthwhile purpose in mind.

Why do we so often feel the need to have some kind of sound in the background, whether it be music or talk radio? Perhaps it demonstrates our subconscious desire to block out our innermost thoughts and feelings, to drown out that inner voice. Should we attribute this type of behavior to restlessness and boredom alone? How about the countless individuals who seem to have highly organized lives, with all of their “ducks in a row” in terms of finances, family, relationships, career, homes, vehicles, toys? I guarantee you that they, too, have their periodic bouts with anxiety and displays of idiosyncratic conduct. I am suggesting that all of us, to varying degrees, share in this phenomenon.

On September 13, 1848, a tragic accident occurred that would shake up the world of medical science. The following is a true story about a man named Phineas P. Gage.

Phineas, a 25-year-old railroad construction foreman in Vermont, was in charge of blasting through a mountainous region for the purpose of laying down a new railroad line. The routine was simple: drill a deep hole into the rock, fill it partially full with explosive powder, and then cover the powder with sand. A tamping iron was next used to pound down on the sand, sealing and compacting the charge. Finally a fuse would be lit to detonate the explosion. On that fateful day, everything was going as planned. The long hollow hole had been drilled, the explosive powder was put in the hole, but someone forgot to put in the sand. Phineas began tamping directly over the powder. A spark flew and ignited the powder and a powerful blast came forth from the hole.

The 13-pound tamping iron, about 1 inch thick and 3 feet long, was propelled directly at him. With the force of a missile, the iron penetrated Gage's face under his left cheekbone, behind his left eye, through his brain, and then out again.

Amazingly, this traumatic accident did not kill Phineas. In fact, he lived for another 13 years and had regained nearly all of his physical strength. He seemed just as mentally sound; he could speak and do physical tasks just as well, and his memory was apparently unimpaired. But he was no longer the same man.

Before the accident, he was a well-loved, responsible, and intelligent worker and husband. He was known as a person with high morals and was described, according to one account, as "a pious and reverent man." So excellent was Phineas' character that work records lauded him as "the most efficient and capable foreman" employed at the Rutland and Burlington Railroad.

After the accident, Phineas experienced a terrible moral decline. He became very emotional about things and would get angry quickly. He lost interest in spiritual things.

He became irreverent and prone to excessive profanity. He lost all respect for social customs and propriety, and his company dismissed him when he would no longer responsibly perform his duties.

Phineas' traumatic accident cost him his personality, his moral standards, and his commitment to family and loved ones. Researchers have concluded that he had lost an important part of his brain called the "frontal lobe." It is the part of our brain that is responsible for moral reasoning and social behavior.

It is necessary to expand our understanding on this vital part of our mental machinery, its physiological properties, and the symptoms associated with it when it is compromised. The brain is divided into several sections, or lobes. Each lobe has specific functions. The frontal lobe, behind the forehead, is the largest section of the brain. It is the seat of judgment, reasoning, intellect and willpower; and it is the place of spirituality and morality. In short, herein lies the character of man.

In the late 1800s, psychiatrists began using a surgical procedure called a "frontal lobotomy." It is literally the removal of the frontal lobe. Sometimes a portion of the frontal lobe was removed, but at other times it was "functionally" removed by merely severing its nerve connections. The operation was used on people who were pathologically violent or criminally insane. The practice of administering the frontal lobotomy became increasingly popular in the 1930s and 1940s; however, today this procedure is rarely used.

Numerous studies over the years have further concluded that those who have suffered frontal lobe damage often exhibit a severe lack of restraint and are prone to boasting and

hostility. They are easily distracted and restless, lacking in foresight, incapable of abstract reasoning, and may live in a fantasy world.

Diseases caused by frontal lobe damage include mania, obsessive-compulsive disorder, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, depression, and increase of appetite. In 2004, in the U.S. alone, over 56.1 million adults were diagnosed with these and other related mental disorders. ADHD is growing at an alarming rate each year in children between six and thirteen years of age, with some studies estimating as many as 1 in 5 children are now afflicted. Sophisticated brain scans (PET scans) reveal that depressed patients may have a 60 percent reduction in frontal lobe blood flow. The good news is that studies have shown that when the blood flow to the frontal lobe is increased, depression can be markedly improved and corrected.

At birth we receive the gift of free will. As we grow and learn, shaped by our families and our environment, free will develops and becomes a big part of our character. Most of us develop a sense of what is right and what is wrong, or what is intelligent and what is unintelligent. Most of us understand that having been given this gift of free will; we have an innate duty to be responsible for our actions, because the decisions we make will have profound consequences upon our lives and the lives of family, friends and colleagues. I will stress in this book that we keep this part of our mental apparatus in the best possible working order. From the dwelling place of the psyche comes forth the fruit of our existence.

I suggest that it is possible that we have been subtly and blindly giving away this gift of free will to “objects,” both animate and inanimate, that have been conveniently placed at our feet in our consumer-oriented society... and designed to control us. If you have

never considered thoughts along these lines, then perhaps you should start. Like hordes of tiny, invisible vampires, these “objects” feed on us as we “slumber.” Our free will is still present, but more and more it is lacking in judgment. We are making less intelligent choices and more brainless ones. Think about it. Examples are all over the evening news. If you look carefully, you will see it in your family, your friends, your workplace, your church, your school board, your city, state and national government. The tricky part for us is to see it in ourselves. Over time we are becoming more and more feeble, and we are surrendering our free will without even knowing it. Only by identifying and understanding the nature of the problem will we understand how to combat it. Once we have acquired this essential understanding, we can begin to overcome the constant assaults against our character.

It seems logical to me that if an enemy can remain so clandestine that he seems non-existent, we will naturally conclude that there is no enemy. We will then be easily overtaken and manipulated. This condition brings about a state of mind that will deter our ability to formulate good, sound reasoning, dwarf our intuitions and perceptions, and give way to the most carnal aspects of our nature.

We are all being more or less “lobotomized”... not in some violent, explosive moment like poor old Phineas, but slowly and insidiously, and the day will eventually come to pass when we exhibit his same symptoms. The good news is that this outcome is not inevitable, provided that we wake up, recognize the problem and take positive action against it. It is absolutely necessary that our ability to make sound, independent judgments be restored to us before we can realize the fullness of our true destiny.

It is time for us to begin unmasking the genius behind our deception, and the many ways in which it chips away at our free will and undermines our potential. Let us begin to peel away the veil one layer at a time, and we will see that there is a consistent thread of enchantment being weaved in our minds.

The sorcerer's invasion is calculated to influence our sensory powers. He has fabricated an illusory modern day society that flashes and glitters, and our minds are gifted with a fantastic ability to fully conform to the messages communicated through the five senses. At every turn on the road of life attacks are being launched, specifically designed to pervert our sensibilities for the purpose of transforming us. This transformation is far more destructive than most people can imagine. As the network of ten billion cells convey the sights, sounds and sensations of the outside world, that data feeds into the memory base of the brain, where a permanent record is kept of the sum total of all sensory information obtained. We will learn about the carefully calculated methods that clearly compromise this vital part of our mental equipment, which we call the frontal lobe.

## 2. LET ME ENTERTAIN YOU

A significant portion of this and the following chapter will be used in examining certain Latin and Greek word elements and to look at their underlying definitions in the English language. The word “entertainment” is a good one to begin with.

“Enter” means to “come in;” “tain” means to hold or “possess” as in “to attain,” and “ment” means to keep in a “state of possession.” Unlike the stereotypical Hollywood image of “possession” as a wild-eyed, drooling, cursing, levitating person, a possessed person will often look completely normal on the surface, while on the inside he or she is completely ridden with confusion and emotional agitation.

Another word to look at is “amusement,” which is a synonym for the word entertainment. The dictionary meaning for amuse is, “to deceive by diverting attention.” In Greek mythology, one definition for a “muse” is, “a guiding spirit.” We know that the entertainment world is a huge business, which generates billions of dollars. On the surface, it seems like harmless fun that gives us respite and escape from the stress of our every day lives. But, is it more than that? Is it possible that in the process, it also has managed to keep us in a state of possession by diverting our attention through deception? Has it succeeded in taking us away from our noblest pursuits and objectives? Before you say no to that thought, think a moment. What kind of music are your kids listening to? How are they dressing? Who are their heroes? What publications are filling the magazine racks at the check-out counters? How many bodies can your son pile up in

2 minutes in a video game? How many tattoos or pierced body parts does your daughter have... that you know of? What percentage of TV and cable programs now feature explicit heterosexual or gay material? I could continue, but I think I have made my point.

Some time ago, a close friend of mine reminded me of a slogan he first heard way back in the early 50s. I immediately was cognizant of the message as he recalled it. On the radio, a resonant-throated announcer gave this catchphrase. It was also presented through a small rectangular picture tube, or a round one, if you had a Zenith TV set like our family did. It went something like this: "RCA... bringing the world into your home." As I think about that phrase in light of events over the last 50 years, I believe that our submission to television in our homes is easily the most destructive blow against the nuclear family to date.
